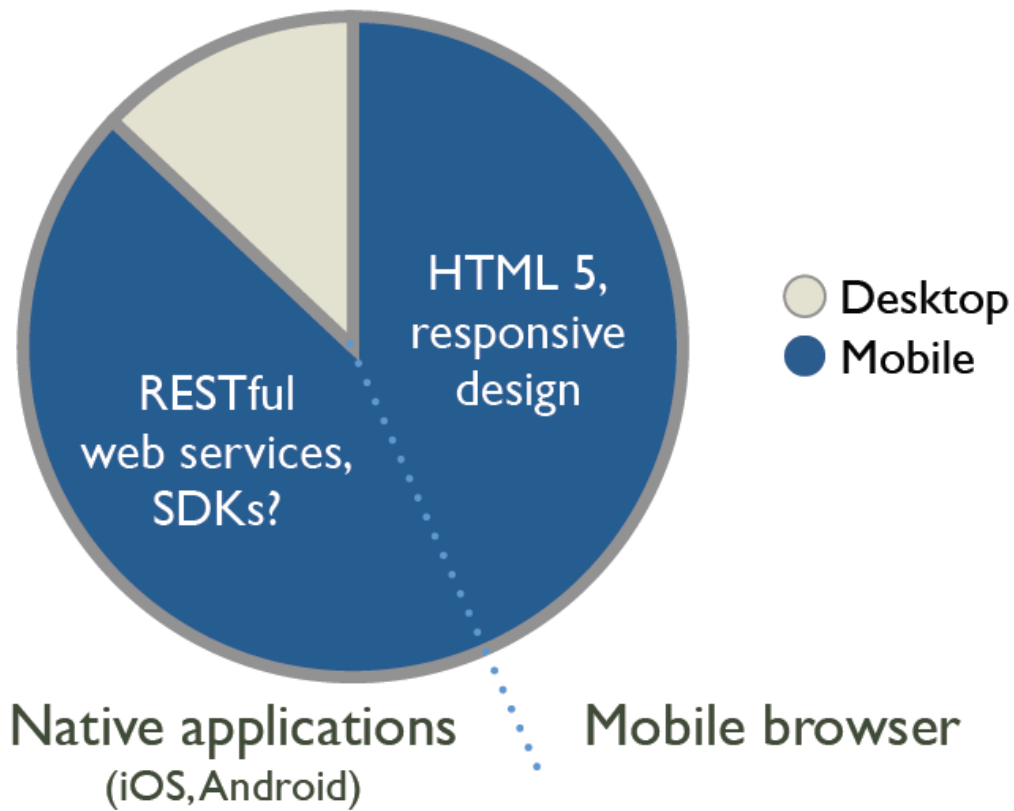



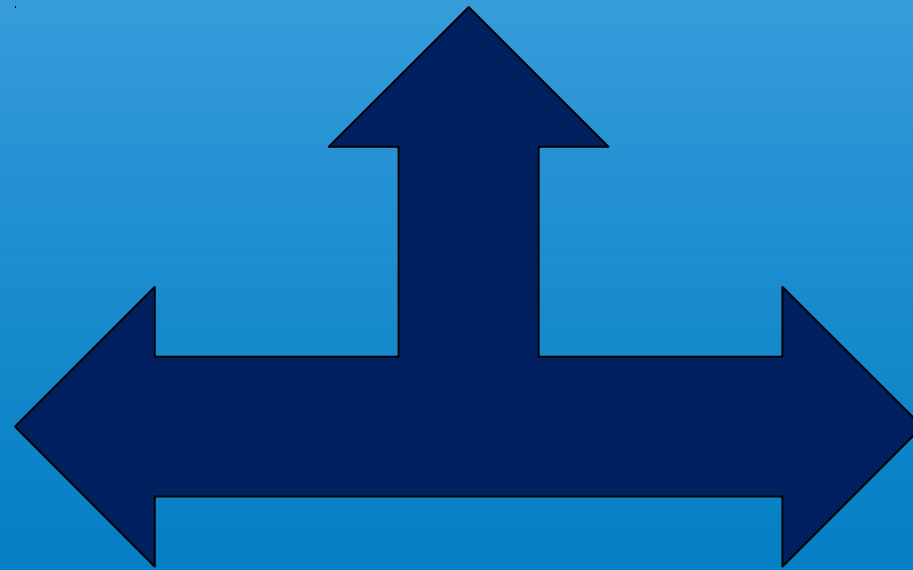

Manual subtheming

1. Copy **CTRL+C** ../sites/all/themes/omega/starterkits/omega-html5

2. Paste **CTRL+V** ../sites/all/themes/

3. Rename folder **omega-html5** to **drupalcamp**

4. Rename files(../sites/all/themes/drupalcamp/css):

YOURTHEME-alpha-default to **drupalcamp-alpha-default**

YOURTHEME-alpha-default-narrow to **drupalcamp-alpha-default-narrow**

YOURTHEME-alpha-default-normal to **drupalcamp-alpha-default-normal**

YOURTHEME-alpha-default-wide to **drupalcamp-alpha-default-wide**

5. Rename .info file to **drupalcamp.info** and delete this line from .info file:

; IMPORTANT: DELETE THESE TWO LINES IN YOUR SUBTHEME

```
hidden = TRUE
```

```
starterkit = TRUE
```

6. Change **name** and **description** of your theme in your **.info** file
7. Go to **Appearance->List and Enable** and set default
8. Remember to **Enable Alpha and Omega Core Themes !!!**

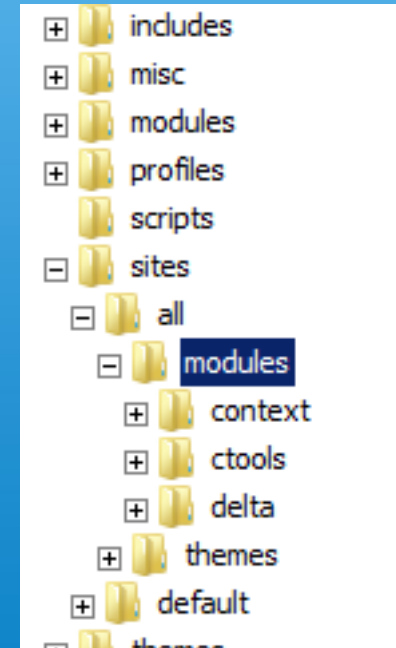
